Junior Sweepstakes Competition-The following classes will be offered for both dogs and bitches

Junior, 12 Mos & Under 14 Mos.
Junior, 14 Mos. & Under 16 Mos.
Junior, 16 Mos. & Under 18 Mos.

Best in Junior Sweepstakes- The winners of the six classes will compete for Best in Junior Sweepstakes & Best of Opposite Sex to Best in Sweepstakes

Minutes of the 50th Annual Meeting

Grand Sweepstakes Winner- The winner of The Best in Puppy Sweepstakes and Best in Junior Sweepstakes will compete for Best in Grand Sweepstakes

If approved, this procedure will begin at the 2015 National Specialty.
Motion carried.

Larry Letsche moved to Expand and Reclassify the Special Attraction-Bred-By- Competition **held at the Annual Bichon Frise Club of America's National Specialty. This motion was seconded by Deb Gibb.** The following clarification was included in discussion.

This competition will not be for points & the dog or bitch does not have to be entered in any other event. The handler in this event must be the breeder of record & an owner of record of the dog or bitch they are entering at the time entries close. Champions and Grand Champions of Record when the entries close must be shown in the proper class
The following classes will be provided for both dogs and bitches

6Mos & Under 9 Mos 9Mos & Under 12 Mos.
12 Mos & Under 15 Mos 15 Mos & Under 18 Mos. Open
Champions Grand Champions

The first place winners of all 14 classes will then compete together for Special Attraction Best of Breed and Special Attraction Best of Opposite Sex to Best of Breed. Non-regular ribbons would be given out for these classes with Rosettes for First in Each Class, Special Attraction Best of Breed & Special Attraction *Best* of Opposite Sex to Best of Breed.

If approved, this procedure will begin at the 2015 National Specialty.
Motion was approved.

A third motion made by Larry to require publication of the annual meeting and board meeting in the Bulletin following the National was withdrawn by Larry.

A motion by Deb Gibb to use the first two winners of the judges selection for sweepstakes and bred-by-exhibitor and offer the first winner their choice of either judging sweepstakes or bred-by exhibitor. Janet Jamison seconded this motion. Motion carried.

This made a big impression on the volunteers which in turn will make it very easy to get workers for next years trial. Also we thank Dave Hill of Apex Dog Agility, who made the weekend even more fun, by donating two agility jumps. One was used as a **"Worker Grand Raffle" prize on Sunday**--the second jump as a prize for all NQ (non-qualifying) runs for the weekend.

The AKC Delegate committee meetings were held June 8, 2014 and the Delegate meeting was June 9, 2014 in Newark, NJ.

May 12, 2012, AKC and the sport of purebred dogs lost a dear friend, Dr. William (Bill) Newman. Bill passed away at his home in Bedford, PA. He was an AKC Board Member and a breeder of English Mastiffs. He will be greatly missed.

There was a vote on the proposed amendment to Article VI, Section 5 of the Charter and By-laws of the American Kennel Club which deals with the eligibility of a Delegate. The By-laws Committee withdrew the Second Portion of the Amendment which deals with the cruelty convictions, which is already covered under AKC Policy. There was a motion to divide the question on Article VI, Section 5. Of the Charter and By-laws of the American Kennel Club. This motion failed. The proposed amendment did not receive an affirmative vote of two-thirds of the Delegates, and was therefore not adopted.

Mrs. Gretchen Bernardi thanked the By-laws Subcommittee and the Committee as well as the Delegates who gave a lot of thought to the proposed amendment. She indicated that the **Committee's intent is to get more Delegate input so that it can rework the amendment with the intentions to bring it back to the Delegate body again.**

As there was no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 11:25 a.m.



Best Junior Handler was Rachel Zobolas showing Zeus.


Best Veteran was Roxy in the 6-10 Veteran Class owned by Lindsay Van Keuren.
